The approved books are:

- 8) Among The Hidden by M. Haddix
- 9) Down A Dark Hall by Lois Duncan
- 10) Loser by J. Spinelli

In each of these novels you will find common themes. The protagonists, or main characters, are young people who are facing challenges. Similarly, as you enter middle school, you will learn to adapt to the challenges presented in a new, exciting school environment.

When you start Weber on September 9, 2009, you will be required to participate in class discussions directly related to your novel. Since all families will be mailed this letter at home, it is expected that all students will have this first school assignment completed for the first day of school.
