### Army, Navy '12' Test To Be Here Nov. 9

The second Qualifying Test for the Army Specialized Training Program and the Navy College Program V-12 will be given here on November 9.

Information and pamphlets, including admission forms may be obtained at the high school office after Oct. 3.

Boys who are recent graduates or will graduate from high school before March 1, 1944 and who will be between 17 and 21 inclusive as of March 1, 1944, are eligible to take the test.

Boys who are eligible and desire to take the test should apply for a credentials at the office and indicate whether they wish to take the test to qualify for the Army or the Navy program.
