

Southampton Wins Over Port 12-6

A scrappy, driving Southampton aggregation topped our Portmen Saturday to the not-so-musical tune of 12-6. The maroon and white outfit was small, but had plenty of what-it-takes to come out on the right end of a score. Port got under way in the first period with devastating steam-roller tactics. Three successive first downs put the ball on the Southampton 20, where the attack suddenly bogged down. Neither team did much with the ball for the rest of the period.

The second quarter was a different story with a sad, sad ending for the Costellomen. Sweeping consistently around end and tackle, the whirlwing attack brought Southampton deep in blue and white territory. A three yard plunge by Mahoney was the beginning of the end. The attempted conversion was unsuccessful. A Port fumble enabled the Maroon and White machine to start rolling once again. A completely disorganized Port defense provided excellent passing opportunities, of which Southampton took good advantage. In less time than it takes to tell, Nugent went over from the 5 for the second tally. Again the try for the point after touchdown was no good.

New Port Team

The second half brought forth a new Port team. Fighting, charging, and smashing, the Portmen asked and gave no quarter. The Southampton offense was helpless against the savage Port tackling. Their first four downs in the third period yielded a net gain of minus six yards. Gaining possession of the ball, the Blue and White opened up with a withering aerial bombardment. Desperate fourth down passes worked and the Portmen were in scoring position.

A forty yard pass from Mesch dropped in Younger's arms and he scored, unmolested. The drop kick for the extra point was smothered under a horde of white jerseyed players. The final stanza was a panorama of fast moving events. The losing team trying desperately to score in the closing minutes of a hard fought game, provided a storybook plot. That is, all except for the happy ending. A Southampton interception was the end of Blue and White hopes for a victory. The Port team outran, outpassed, outkicked, outplayed, and did everything but outscore the spunky Southampton gridders.
