### Restrictions On Driver Licenses

What is a driver's license? What are its restrictions? Have you ever wondered if it is legal to drive to school dances at night? These and other related questions will be discussed in the following article.

There are four types of commonly used licenses: Learners Permit, Junior Operator License, Operator's License at the Age of Seventeen, and Operator's License.

**A Learner's Permit** is only good in the state of New York. It is only good when a person holding such a permit is driving with a licensed operator in the seat next to him. A Learner's Permit for a Junior Operator's License is not legal in New York City.

**A Junior Operator's License** may be obtained at the age of sixteen by a person qualifying. It is not legal in New York City, out of New York State, or after dark. It may be used after dark provided a licensed operator over eighteen is with said driver. It is legal for school activities after dark only if activities are actually classes or required courses or subjects at the school. This does not include any type of sports, dances, or musical productions. It is not valid if the said holder operates a motor vehicle for hire on public roads.

**An Operator's License at the age of 17**, may be obtained only by successfully completing an approved course in driver education. It grants the holder all privileges of driving in New York State. It is not valid out of the state.

**An Operator's License** grants the holder all privileges of driving both in and out of New York State.
