Dick Oswald - Dick was pro-moted from the J.V. team, which he was a member of last year, to the Varsity this year, and has proved a needed member.


Jimmy Gilbert - Last year Jimmy was on both J.V. football and basketball. This year he moved to the Varsity squads of both teams, and was an asset to them.
