May 14 the Modern Dance Recital will be presented in the PDSHS auditorium at 8:30 p.m. One hundred eighty-five girls will participate.

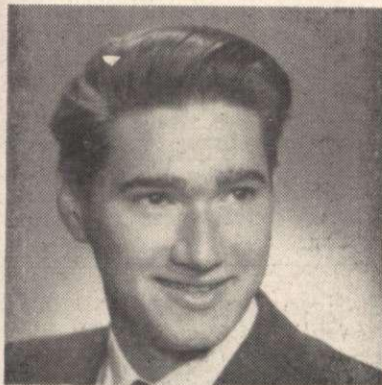
