After the singing of the National Anthem, the Reverend Jesse Starr, Rector of the First Baptist Church, will give the Invocation.

The Valedictory address by Robert Metzger will follow. A flute solo, "Cantabile et Presto" by George Enesco, will be rendered by William Wagner.

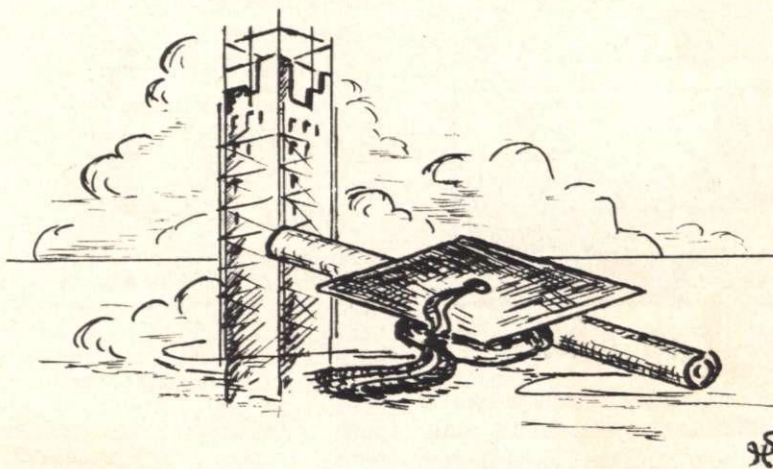
