Question: Who has the best relay team on Long Island?

Two weeks ago the Blue and White relay team took first place at the Long Island championships — incidentally breaking Port High's previous 880 yard relay record.

Ray Saulter, Noel Certain, Bob Slusser and Jay Purdy burned up the 880 yards at Sewanhaka High two weeks ago in an incredible one minute and 32.2 seconds.

The first track meet of the year, the Port Invitation, saw fourteen schools competing for the honors. The Blue and White took only one blue ribbon—the relay team. However Saulter, Purdy and Certain each placed third in the 100 yard dash, the 220 yard dash and the broad jump, respectively.

Unfortunately, the rest of the Blue and White, especially the weight men (shot put, discus, etc.) failed to get the points needed.

The Port cindermen lost their first three meets with Oyster Bay, Garden City and Great Neck. But the track team then bounced back to win two out of the remaining three — Mineola and Manhasset, losing to West-bury by only four points.

Coach Zeitler was satisfied with this year's team but expressed the wish that more boys go out for the team, especially in the weights division. Zeitler coached track for eight years at St. Ann's Academy, before coming here.
