## Dean Is New Star In 'East Of Eden'

Filmed by Elia Kazan, "East of Eden" will come to the Beacon Theater June 15 through 18. Julie Harris, James Dean and Raymond Massey, with Burl Ives and Richard Davalos star in this CinemaScope, WarnerColor film production.

Described as John Steinbeck's most passionate novel, "East of Eden" is the story of earthy,

emotional characters, each dependent upon another. The film concerns itself with the last part of the novel; the story of Adam Trask, his sons, Aron and Cal, their mother, Kate, and the girl, Abra and their search for love.

The people of "East of Eden" are made real by the things they do and say and want. Steinbeck created fictional individuals, each rounded with life, each asserting for himself his power to choose between good and evil. It is the recognition of this power which gives each fictional character the stature which makes him a spokesman for a flesh-and-blood person.

Steinbeck wrote of his book, "The subject (of "East of Eden") is the only one man has ever used as his theme — the existence, the balance, the battle, and the victory in the permanent war between wisdom and ignorance, light and darkness—good and evil."
