(2) Attend as many meetings as possible (no more than two absences)

B. Juniors who were not members of Junior Red Domino must earn at least one credit in the fall term to become members of Red Domino. After gaining membership they must satisfy two additional requirements to maintain their standing.

(1) To attend as many meet-

(1) To attend as many meetngs as possible (no more than two absences)

(2) To earn additional credits for a total of three during the year.

C. Seniors who earned three credits in their junior year are automatically members of Red Domino again. To maintain their membership they must fulfill the requirements for Juniors who were in Jr. Red Domino. (See II A. Sections (1) and (2).)

D. Seniors who were inactive in Red Domino during their junior year must complete the following:

(1) Earn at least two credits in the fall term before being accepted as a member.

(2) To maintain membership they must:

(a) attend as many meetings as possible (no more than two absences allowed)

(b) earn an additional credit during the year for a total of at least three for the year.
