## BACCALAUREATE

The annual Baccalaureate ceremony of the Senior Class will occur June 15 at 7:30 in the Schreiber auditorium. As is traditional, the evening's events will be completely handled by the Seniors, under the auspices of Mrs. Lawrence as program head and speaking coach.

The program will consist of speakers and readings interspersed with musical interludes.

Four speakers were selected by a board of teachers at a competitive audition to which all Seniors were invited to submit speeches. Scott Sobel will speak on being an individual; Steve Althuler will discuss student demonstrations; Pam Johnson will speak on the domestic exchange program; and Don Spencer will discuss living together peacefully.

## Spring Banquet Held

The caper of Schreiber's successful season of sports, the Spring Sports Banquet, was held Wednesday night in the school cafeteria. The festivities began at 8:00 P.M. when Master of Ceremonies, Dr. Waldo Scott, introduced guest speaker, Mr. Frank Rienzo, the head track and field coach at Georgetown University. Mr. Rienzo, after wishing the baseball team luck in the playoffs and congratulating Kevin Reilly for his performance in the Section 8 meet, opened his talk to the assembly of Varsity Letter winners. He spoke about the virtues of team membership in high school and what it will mean to the athlete in his adult life. In closing, Mr. Rienzo expressed a fervent hope that the athletic program at Schreiber would continue to function as well as it has.

With the evening in full swing, the next item on the agenda was the presentation of the various trophies and plaques as well as the Varsity Letter awards. The Track team, headed by Coach Zeitler, was first, with the Coaches Award, Pete Mertz Award, and "Extra-Effort" Award going to Kevin Reilly, Kit Pratt, and Wayne White respectively. Baseball was next and Mr. Cutler, who has headed the North Shore Champs, bestowed the Coaches Award to Rich Edmunson and the Charles W. Hoins Award to David Beck. Coach Tepper, representing the Lacrosse team, next stepped to the podium to make his team presentations. The Coaches Award went to Dick McKee and something new this year, the "Most Improvement" Award, went to Joe Malley. Last, the Golf team, led by Mr. Meystrik, stepped up for their awards and here, Alan Zaremba got the Coaches Award.

The trophies for the outstanding achievers of the year were next. As Athletic Director, Mr. Tom Romeo, made the presentations. This year a special award was given out to a boy who was the unanimous choice by all the coaches as the one who had "done the most for sports": Steve Atchulter. The Varsity Club Sportsmanship Award was presented to one of the truly "good sports" in this school, John Mella. The William B. Fearon Award, which goes to the athlete who also excels in his schoolwork and is active in the school this year went to Robert Hoffman. Finally, the award given to the boy who is, in the opinion of the coaches, the outstanding athlete at Schreiber, the John Marino Award, was presented to David Beck.

Closing remarks by Dr. Scott brought the evening to an end, but it is agreed that it was truly a memorable one for everyone present.

## Athlete of the Year

Fading back to pass, popping from the top of the key, or breaking off a curve, Dave Beck was in the action in Port Washington athletics. Dave was always a leader, a quarterback in football, the equivalent in basketball and the head man in baseball. Dave was the man to do things after, the man who instructed, the teammate who did it all.

Mr. Beck earned 7 Varsity letters in his high school career, two both in football and basketball, and three in baseball. In all three sports he played a major part in their excellent seasons as he led football to an undefeated season, helped put basketball into the playoffs, and led along with Tom Henderson, the baseball team into the counties.

At quarterback the 7-0-1 season was marked by Dave's famous last drive, producing the Mineola tie. Throughout the season Dave's adeptness at reading defenses was superb and perhaps was his greatest skill. He threw for over 1100 yards, running for 300 more.

The weakest of his three sports is basketball, the only sport in which there lies no future for him. At 5'8" Dave is just too short to go on, but he did a tremendous job all season, averaging over 12

a game in league play, and making up for his disadvantages with a great deal of hustle, and fine outside shooting.

The last of his sports was highlighted by what Coach Cutler termed, "His greatest game in his three years on varsity." Pitching with just 1 day rest in the county championships Dave Beck showed what a great competitor he was. After 9 tough innings on Tuesday, he threw 7 more on Thursday with a constant sharp pain and a burning sensation in his arm. Dave saw a great deal of action pitching wise towards the latter part of the season and he did quite a job.

The Port Trackmen have now finished the Spring season as they racked up an overall record of 1-7-1. However, the playoffs leading to the County and State Championships offered some solace in an otherwise bleak season for the Blue Blazers.

At the Division II Championship Meet, hosted by Port this year, some amazing performances were turned in, as twelve Port runners placed in the meet. Kevin Reilly once again astounded everyone as he captured the field in the 880 with

It began on the last of March and ended on the 5th of June. The Viking's baseball team's season was a long grueling struggle which left them one notch from the top.

The type of team we had this year was something special. Coach Cutler had commented that, "I have never seen a group of boys that worked so well together." Mr. Cutler said that this was his best team ever, although he had won the North Shore's two years ago.

But this team was something different. They were always loose, they relaxed and had the stuff when they needed it. Sitting on the bench throughout the season made me aware that we just knew we were going places, there was just this air about us.

After Port lost twice to East Meadow in the Counties, after winning the first game, I thought back to the highlights of our season. There was no one incident in a game that strikes you, but the wild bus rides that took place tend to stand out. I named this team the masters of the put-down because not a word could be uttered on a trip before someone jumped on you, and if you weren't careful the whole team was on your back. Obviously they had something good because away from home the Vikings were 11-0 before the East Meadow losses.

The most exciting bus ride followed the easiest of Port's six playoff games. Tom Henderson had just pitched a magnificent 3-hitter against Mineola with just two days rest. The Vikings supplied only 4 hits but were good enough for 2 runs. As the umpire called the third strike on the last batter Tom Henderson flew into the air, in the 97 degree weather. Twelve teammates greeted him and after the peak of ecstasy had subsided everyone was on the bus, eager to return.

Water fights were the name of the game as we drove back, and myself along with other select individuals got completely soaked. But as we approached town the yelling started,

everyone opened their windows, everyone was cheering. The volume continued to build and as we went up Main Street towards the boulevard the constant pounding on the sides of the bus made everyone feel really great. Chants of we are number 1 rang through the streets of Port Washington, and just to be a part of it all made me feel tremendous.

The week before the North Shore's, Port faced four teams, one in league play, the rest in playoff action. This is when the team's excellence, their clutch ballplaying, showed up. On some days we would score one run, on others three or four, but it always seemed to me that whenever we needed a run, we got it, and the three playoff 1-run victories proved this.

Along with this another Port oddity prevailed, right through the county championships. Port faced the team's best pitcher, and beat him, but the second and third stringers gave them trouble. That was the story in the Mineola season series and the East Meadow games. Sziegthy, the all-county pitcher, was defeated only twice during the season, both times Port was the opposition. But in the second game of the season series against

Mineola the Viking's were shut out, forcing them into the playoff for the playoffs vs. Kennedy.

Against Kennedy, Westbury and MacArthur, the latter the defending county champs, Port won 3-2, 2-1, and 3-2. Not once did Port falter or lose their cool, and only once did they trail in a ballgame, that for less than an inning and a half. But the story behind these playoff games was the superb pitching effort of David Beck, Tom Henderson, and Peter Westervelt.

The East Meadow series was highlighted by the courageous efforts of Dave Beck's pitching, and six hits of Tommy Henderson, who made all-county. David won in 9 innings on Tuesday, and came back Thursday but the story of Port lay in their oddity. Scoring 3 off of East Meadow's top pitcher, 2 off of their second and 1 off of their third. Port scored less as the pitching got worse.

On the bus ride home after the final game it was really not what I had expected. Everyone took it well and joked around quite a bit. But Lester Moore summed it up well. "When you've come this close to victory, it is very hard to differentiate between losing and winning." The scene on the bus showed you why.

## Viking Sports Successful

In one of the most exciting games of the season, spectators saw a strong Port team come from behind to tie with Mineola 10-10, thus preserving their undefeated status. The outstanding performances here were turned in by Bruce Borzon and Bob Hoffman, who made the All North Shore team, as well as David Beck, Bill Cronin, and Bill Mauro. Soccer was disappointing, though the team had much talent in John Tobin (All North Shore team), and John Mella, and Tom Cicciariello (both All County team).
