

Barish Prepares to Pave Whitney Field Lax Scrapped to Solve Parking Problem

by R. Maranville In a startling reversal, the Schreiber administration, led by Principal Sidney Barish, has decided to pave over Whitney Field and turn it into student parking, thereby ending both the boys' and the girls' lacrosse programs.

Although the number of students at Schreiber has decreased, the number of students with cars has increased. This has led to a dramatic shortage of parking spaces. Students have been clamoring for years for additional parking, but the administration always resisted. This year, however, the complaints increased so much that Dr. Barish agreed to provide an additional lot, saying, "It's time to turn paradise into a parking lot."
