Four Schreiber Bands Battle It Out *Mystic Rhythms Takes Top Honors*

Mystic Rhythms outplayed their three competitors to win the G.O.'s Battle of the Bands on Friday, March 17.

Mystic Rhythms, with Craig Glantz on lead vocals, Mark Overend on bass guitar, Rob Bordan on drums, Rick Viesta on keyboards and guitar, and Adam Zimmon on guitar made their third major performance before a Schreiber audience a victorious one. The group's performance included covers of Led Zeppelin's "Over the Hills and Far Away," Living Colour's "Cult of Personality," and Kansas' "Carry On My Wayward Son." The set also featured "Living For Today," the band's first original track. Rick Viesta, writer of the song's music and lyrics said, "I was afraid people wouldn't like it." Rick went on to express his satisfaction with the reception the crowd gave his song.

Mystic Rhythms, after the success of their Fall and February concerts and their Battle victory, is planning a G.O. sponsored concert for May 12. Steve Schneiderman promises "awesome special effects and possibly some laser lights."

According to the Student Government, the Battle was a rousing success financially. Faculty advisor Mr. Cahill pointed to \$2125 made in ticket sales. He reported the 605 tickets sold as "what I think is a record." The goal of between \$600 and \$800 was far surpassed.

The Battle featured a co-sponsorship by Domino's Pizza and S.A.D.D./Safe-Rides. Domino's provided the S.A.D.D./Safe-Rides refreshment stand with discounted pizzas. Ticket stubs could also be redeemed for \$1 off of a pizza at the Domino's store.

Organizer Steve Schneiderman said of the sponsorship, "It was a first step toward commercialization." Steve also expressed his satisfaction with the
